Power of Advocacy



- Advocacy is:
 - Organized action in support of an idea or cause; constituents educating elected officials
- The power of collective voice: When we come together around a single cause, we amplify it
- Can I advocate?
 - Yes! You do not need to be an expert in policy to advocate, you are already an expert at what you do in this field

 - \$11.3b for IDEA Part B
 - \$500m for IDEA Part C
 - \$400m for Section 619






- For the second year, we have developed a social media toolkit for your use:

- Members of Congress
- Staff in personal offices
- Some Members will be on key Committees:
 - Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions
 - House Education and Labor Committee
 - Senate and House Appropriations Committee
 - Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Subcommittee







Building an Effective Case



- Illustrate a need
- Build a sense of urgency
- Tell a personal story that connects the issue to your district
- Make the "ask"
- Invite questions to further engage with your delegation

Establish yourself as an expert on a specific topic and becoming a trusted resource







Power of Being a Constituent



- State/local connection
 - Members prioritize issues that impact their state/district
- Personal connection
 - Member or staff may be familiar with your school district/region, may know you or your colleagues
- Members will always be respectful
 - Even if you disagree on policy, your Representatives and their staff will be kind (*with very rare exception)
 - Their job is to serve your interests
 - Staff members and Members of Congress are human beings





Power of Being a Constituent



- A divided Congress is united around issues that are meaningful to them
 - Always be authentic, but speak from your heart about why these issues are important to you as an educator.
 - Expect that some legislators and staff will have personal connections with your stories even if you don't expect this.
- We are only 17 months away from the mid-term elections
 - Follow up with staff who asked for a tour of your building when they are back at home.
 - Forge relationships as much as possible
