Jorja lives with multiple complex health issues that affect every aspect of her daily life. While navigating life with these complex health issues, she focuses on the needs of others in her community and how she can contribute to improving the lives and experiences of others. Jorja started a successful food collection campaign to improve food security in her area. In tandem with this, she spearheaded a comprehensive accessibility study for her school, which she shared with the principal and superintendent to create a more accessible school environment for all.

When her school celebrated Diversity Week, Jorja and her grandmother sewed a Disability Pride Flag to continue her advocacy for disability awareness, inclusion, and social justice. She has worked hard to overcome challenges to serve as a champion for others. Jorja is passionate about advocating for youth mental health, especially for those who grow up in hospital settings.
